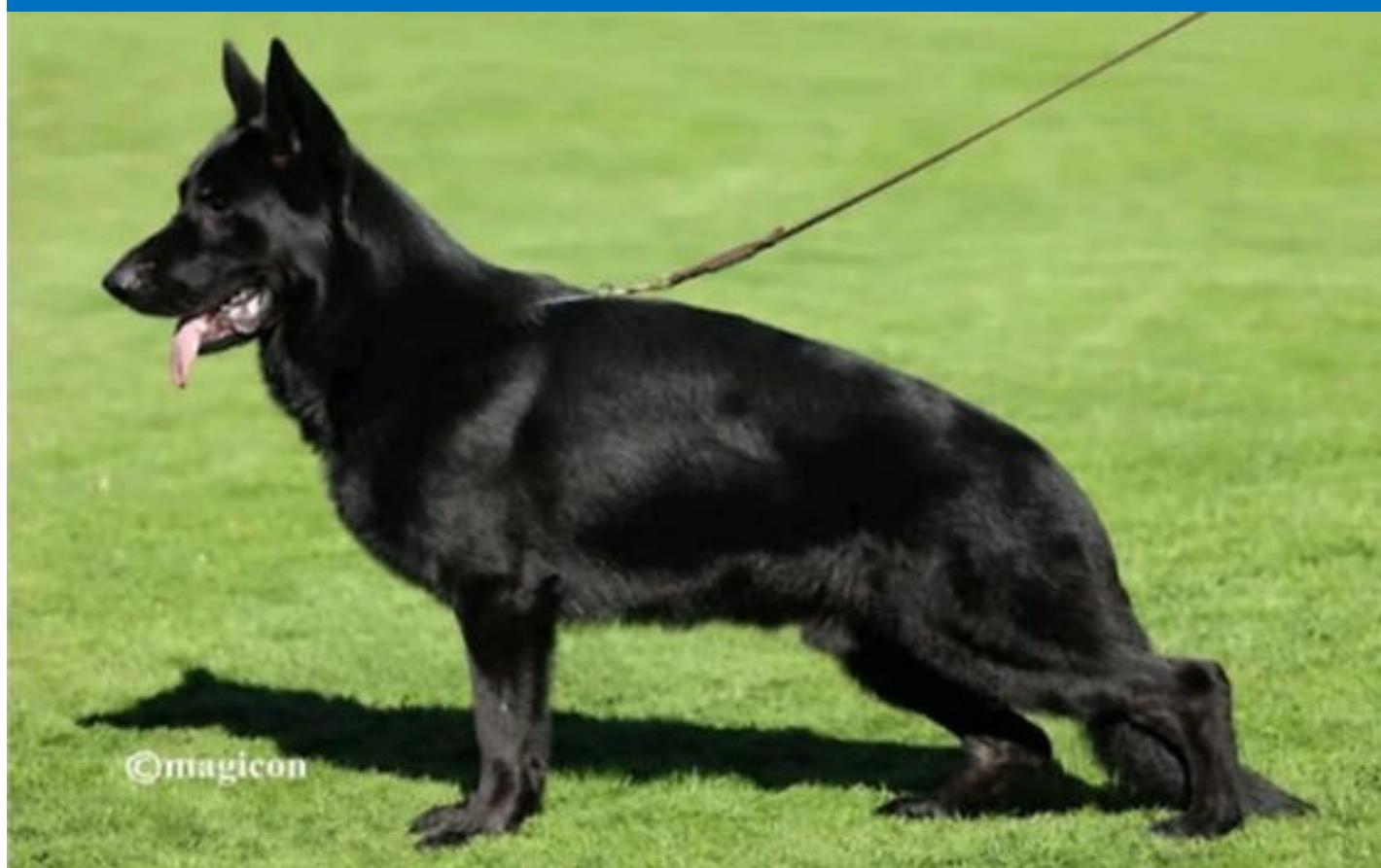

BRG Chairs Report

The British Regional Group (BRG) has made significant strides in 2025, with a fully elected executive committee and an independent membership system designed to foster member engagement. Members are encouraged to join the BRG upon renewing their GSDL membership later this year to actively participate in decision-making processes and in our Annual General Meetings

The year as our 15th Anniversary of the BRG, has been marked by successful regional shows, Körungs, Character Assessments, and the highly acclaimed 'Big GSD Weekend,' which promoted a variety of dog training activities in a hugely enjoyable environment open to all. My sincere thanks to all those involved over the weekend.

A notable development for the BRG is the recognition of two National Körmeisters (Heather Macdonald & Shirley Hutchinson), which allows them to officiate national Körungs and AD's in Great Britain in accordance with the German system, thereby enabling participants to compete both in Germany and the UK under this national framework.

This recognition facilitates participation in German competitions without necessitating all activities to occur in Germany or under German SV Körmeisters.

The only limitation regarding national Körung concerns situations where a dog is anticipated to require a German SZ number, such as for stud purposes in Germany. In these cases, all prerequisites must be fulfilled within Germany. This requirement remains consistent with current regulations; even if an SV judge officiates trials or Körungs in the UK, it does not qualify a dog to obtain an SZ Number.

We have already held one National Körung in England and four are currently planned for 2026 between March and December. Any club can arrange via the Körmeister and/or BRG Secretary to organise an AD. Our GSDL SV working judges can also officiate AD's that will be recognised.

I hope this brief explanation gives you a little more knowledge of the system, but full information is available on the GSDL Website. Also, feel free to contact either Heather or Shirley for any guidance if required.

I look forward to seeing you at the many BRG events still to come in 2025 and for those of you participating with your dogs at the BSZS in Nuremberg, I sincerely wish you all the very best of luck and will be cheering for all GB trained, owned or bred dogs from the stands. There have been some very exciting results for GB dogs this year so here's hoping it's a bumper year for much success.

HEALTH UPDATE SUMMER 2025

There is not much to report this time, as two important meetings/reports will not be sent until after the closing date for this magazine. There is likely to be a change to our Cat.3 Status, but no details are available from the Kennel Club at the moment.

One very frustrating problem is not helping with the collection of samples for Haemangiosarcoma research. Vets are not taking samples from affected dogs before euthanasia to send to Mark Dunning at Nottingham University. I have the sample bottles to send with details from the veterinary surgeon who collected the material. Most of the owners will know nothing about this condition, even though it is not uncommon in GSDs. If one of your owners contacts you to ask for advice on the dogs' condition, please ask them to ask their vet to take a sample before euthanasia. I have had two more reported this week – but the breeders didn't know in time.

We must find a way to get vets on board with all the research being carried out for our breed, which covers many problems, both common and unusual. All information is confidential.

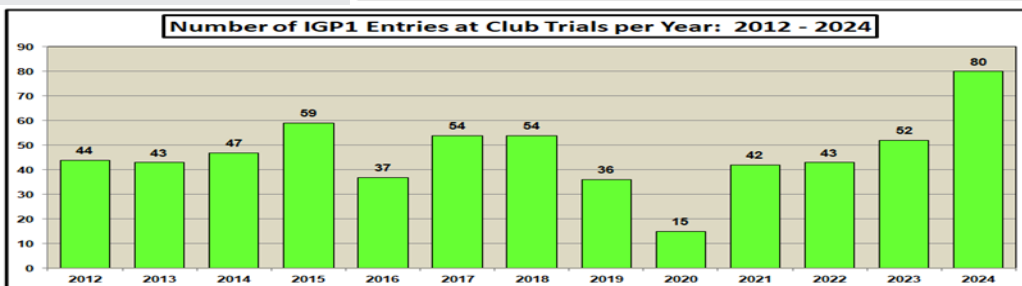
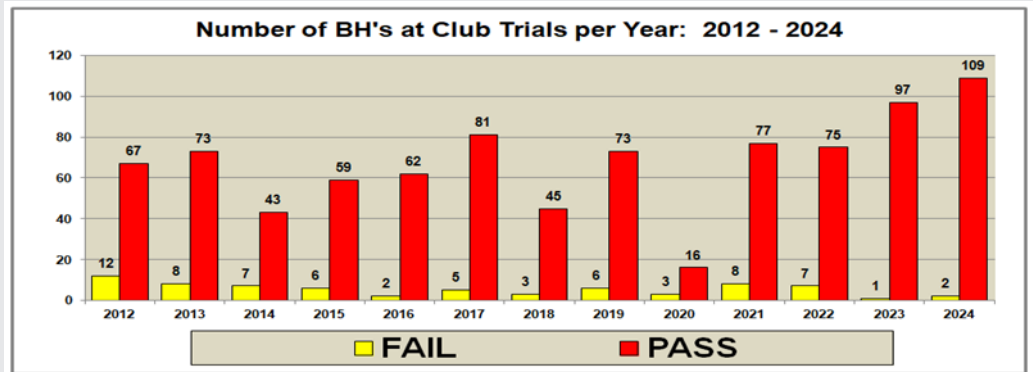

IGP TRIAL STATS

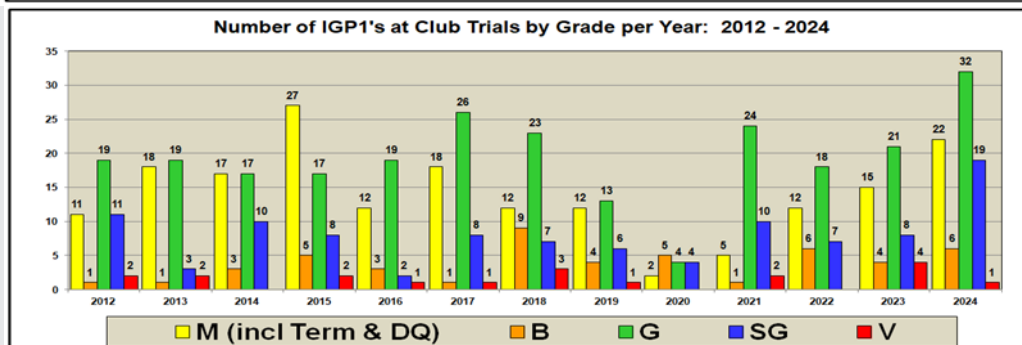
A number of people know I love my spreadsheets and have collated trial information from various sources over the years. Sadly (showing my age now), I did an article for the old BSA 'Scene' magazine of the trial statistics that I had back then. Well I've been badgered and volunteered to do something again as I've been told 'what is the point of having the information and not sharing it out?' (Thank You Jo J). So here goes:

I thought it best to start with the BH as this is the first step on the ladder to commencing the IGP journey. As you can see numbers are steadily increasing but more importantly the failure rate has declined in the last couple of years.

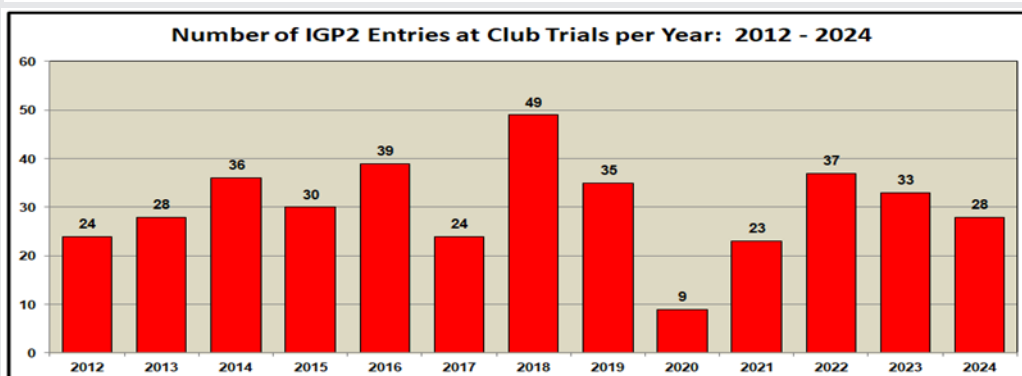


IGP1

Next up we have IGP1, plotted by the Total Entries per Year and also by the various Grades per Year.

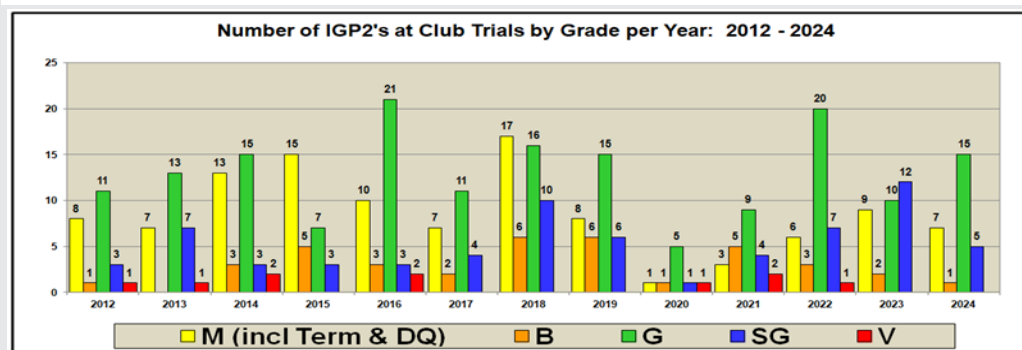


From the graphs you can see that the numbers are rising significantly.



IGP2

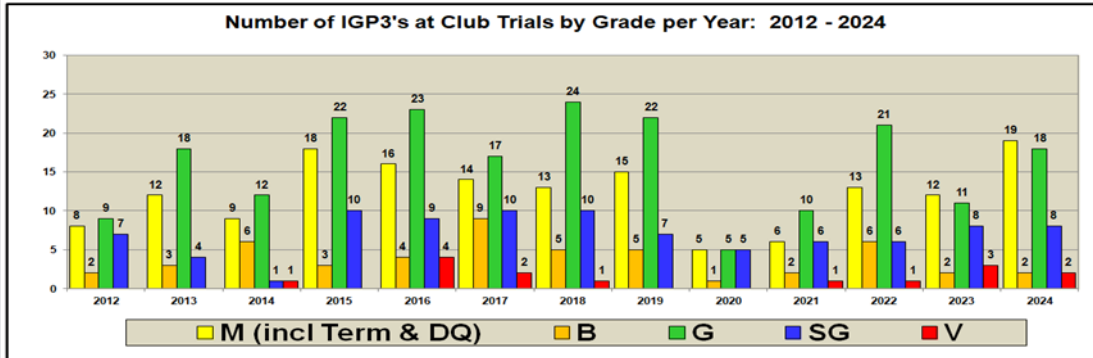
Now on to IGP2 also shown by Total Entries per Year and various Grades per Year.

Next up is IGP3 where numbers haven't really risen or got to where they were in previous years.

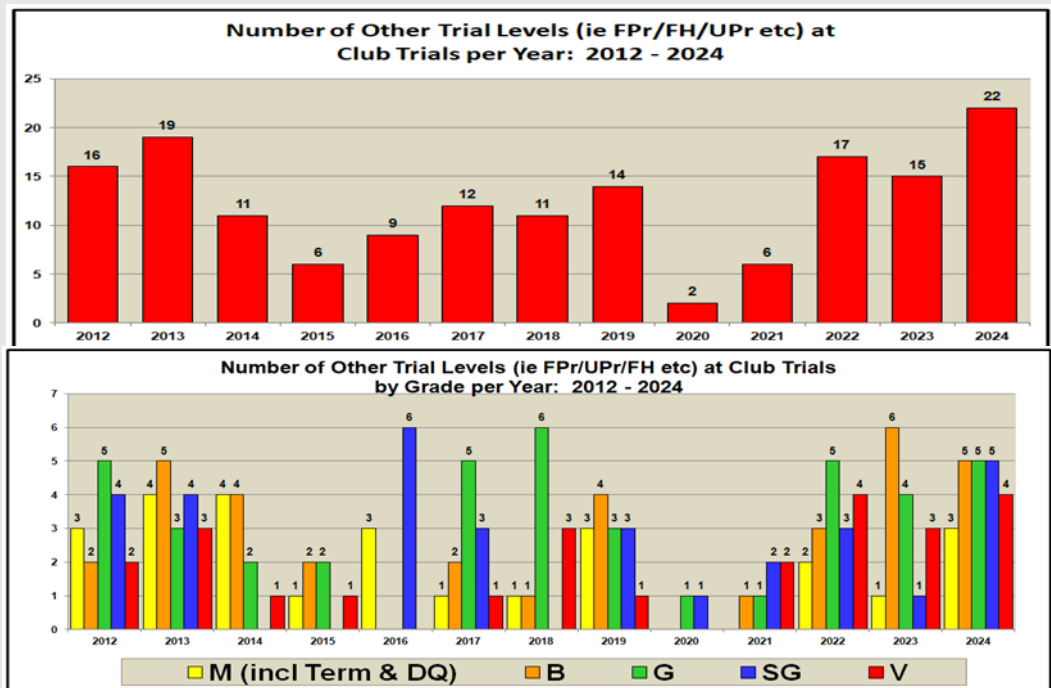


Hopefully going forward with the increase in BH's and IGP1's this will change in the future.

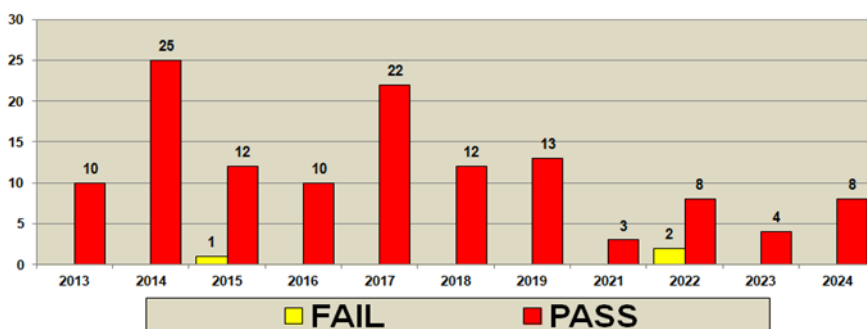
FPr/FH/UPr etc

As previously mentioned these entries are also on the increase.



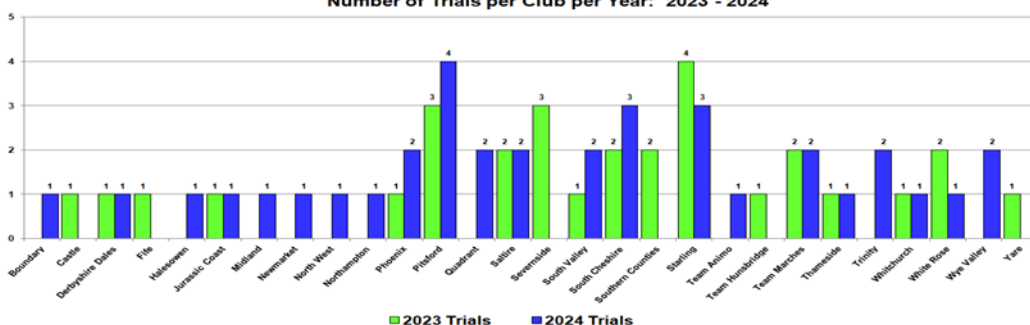
AD's at Club Trials per Year: 2012 - 2024



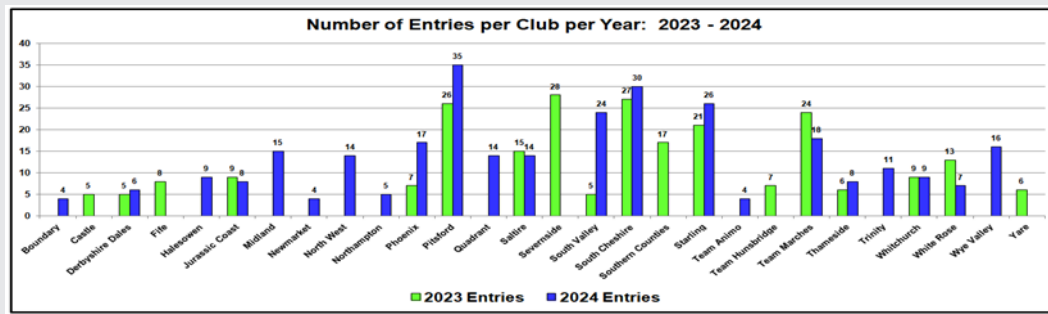

As well as the above there is also the Endurance Test (AD) for all those fit people out there. Looking at the figures they haven't really risen, this in part could be due to the logistics of holding one.

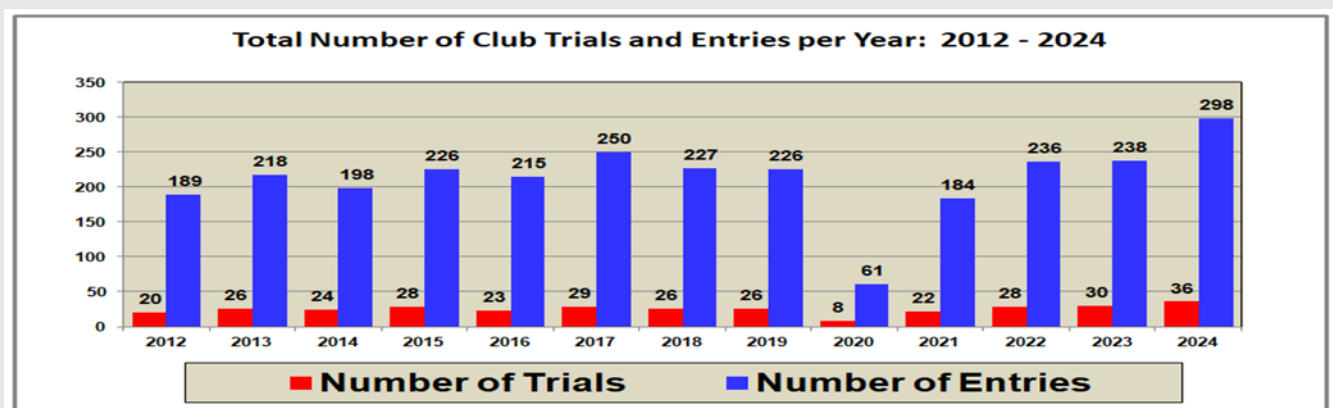
Number of Trials per Club per Year: 2023 - 2024



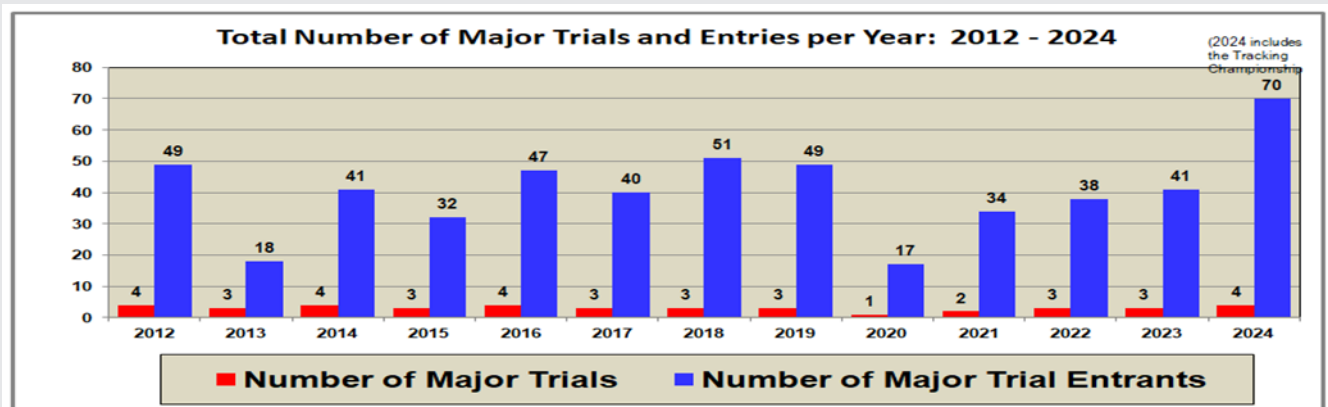
Opposite are two graphs which show which Clubs have hosted Trials over the last 2 years along with the number of entries they have had for the year.

A Review of ‘Lets Speak Dog: Emotional Communication in Dog Training’ by Mia Skogster (Translated by Annira Silver, Published by Mia Skogster, 2022. Available from www.miaskogster.com)

The autobiographical style of dog training manual that has emerged in recent years is a development which brings an added level of interest to what can be a dry subject. Another is a change of focus from dog to handler.

This brings dog sports into the wider sports arena where human psychology has become essential. A good example of this recent trend is Mia Skogster’s book which is an autobiographical dog training manual with a particular slant on the role of the handler in training.

The book has a fairly unique concentration on using different praise voices to motivate and reward dogs and on the development of movement and acting skills in the handler. The focus is informed by the author’s childhood hobbies of ballet and jazz dancing, playing piano and singing in a choir.

Born in Finland, her dog training journey began at the age of 14 years with her first Belgian Shepherd Dog, Jake. She later competed with a BSD Malinois called Helge and achieved a 100 point score in obedience at a world championship event. She writes that through Helge “my passionate hobby became a career that allowed me to meet different cultures, people and dogs.” (p.44)

One of the main themes of the book is that the handler needs to practice voice and body control so words and gestures are used in a consistent way. This means regulating their own emotions and communicating clearly with the dog. Most dog owners will realise that dogs read our non-verbal communication. Any variations, such as nervousness during a competition or irritation and anger when things go wrong, can be picked up by the dog and result in changes to their own emotions and behaviour.

The book covers the essential components of her method of training which she explains does not question existing methods but places greater importance on emotional communication and social learning. Key components of this method are the use of distinct praise voices (she uses six different tones of voice); training through play; teaching self-control; sequencing using meaningful pauses between different commands and actions so that the dog copies the handler and waits attentive to the handler for the next action; using hands and body movements correctly to convey messages to the dog; observing the dog’s body language and only rewarding while it is in a positive emotional state.

In the later chapters she returns to her own experience and describes one of her dogs that “made me rethink everything from the beginning” (p.232). Her Malinois, Inspis, was the most unusual dog she trained because he did not seem to be motivated by food, praise or

ball games but only by extreme experiences and doing things he wanted that were usually things he wasn’t supposed to do. She started to understand how difficult it can be to build up a rapport with some dogs. By working through the difficulties she was successful in training Inspis to compete at the Finnish Malinois championship which he won. They were chosen to represent Finland in the following spring’s FMBB world championships but unfortunately this was cancelled due to the covid pandemic.

The book is expensive at 59 Euros but it makes an interesting read and is up to date on social psychological research and information that has recently been applied to dog training. It is also possible to check out whether or not her style is one that appeals by visiting her website (www.miaskogster.com) and Facebook page.



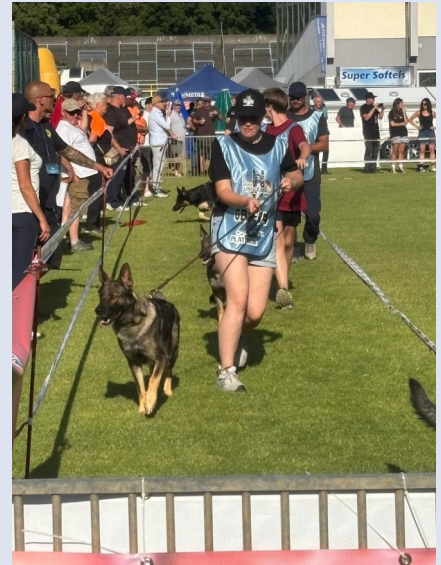
Kala's and My Personal Experience at the WUSV Universal 2025

The event took place in Hanau, a small town in the heart of Germany, situated beside the river Main along one of the most famous historic century old trade routes, as well as the Roman Limes Route that once formed the boundary of the Roman Empire.

Leading up to the event excitement was building up and training intensified to prepare Kala and myself for such a unique competition; combining elements from show, health and IGP work.

Kala exceeded me on the health aspects with a full score, leaving me behind with my artificial knee and hip. It probably comes to nobody's surprise that I relied on an experienced local Universal show handler to present Kala in the show ring. 45 years' in Schutzhund sport did not prepare me for the intense competition in the ring with every change in placement during the 4 hour event carefully noted by eagle-eyed spectators cheering, shouting, whistling, and some running along the ring supporting each team. With full sun and soaring temperatures on Friday, we were exhausted at the end of the day glad to be able to retreat to our cozy cottage in the rolling hills of the Spessart just to the south east of Hanau. I did actually run one round off lead, which finished me off for the day.



Kala had also completed her obedience round just before the mid-day heat. It was a solid performance with two costly mistakes on the retrieves. Still exhausted from the day before, Kala refused to get up the following morning, not comprehending that we had to rise early to get to the tracking grounds. With her head not in the game,



Kala just leisurely walked the track as being out on a stroll. In need of rest (5hrs sleep is just not enough) and shade we enjoyed the hospitality of the local sport club at the tracking grounds offering mixed grill and an amazing ice coffee, as well as an opportunity to make new friends. Relaxed, 3 down/1 to go, Saturday afternoon provided an opportunity to observe the competition in the stadium, eat cake, support team UK, and visit with dog sport colleagues (from the old days) and family.

We had drawn a good slot for the final discipline (protection) on early Sunday morning, with cooler temperature predicted. It was with great disappointment that we couldn't complete the round. Kala's solid performance

wasn't rewarded as she couldn't get a grip on the last reattack with the helper running over her head. Another lesson learned.

Three exciting competition days, although demanding on each dog handler team (including supporters), provided a unique experience and everlasting memories. I am very grateful to friends, family, fellow team mates and the GSDL organization to provide me with this opportunity.

GERMAN SHEPHERD DOG RECLASSIFIED FROM CATEGORY THREE TO CATEGORY TWO ON KENNEL CLUB BREED WATCH

The Kennel Club has announced the reclassification of the German Shepherd Dog from category three to category two of its Breed Watch system, with effect from 1 September 2025.

Breed Watch serves as an 'early warning system' to identify points of concern for the health of individual breeds, and to monitor and address visible health issues effectively. The reclassification is a result of a year-long, collaborative and comprehensive review of data between the Kennel Club and the German Shepherd Dog Breed Council, reflecting a shared commitment to the breed's welfare and future.

It follows a recommendation from the Kennel Club Dog Health Group, which is made up of independent vets, dog experts, canine researchers and welfare organisations, and means that German Shepherd Dog best of breed winners, or those winning their third challenge certificate, will no longer require a veterinary health check at championship dog shows.

The health of the breed will continue to be monitored by the Kennel Club in collaboration with the breed, as part of the breed health plan. Dog show judges will also continue to submit mandatory health monitoring forms after each championship appointment.

The reclassification will be reviewed in twelve months' time and progress of the breed with its broader action plan around judging, handling and education will be continually monitored by the Kennel Club.

Helen Kerfoot, Chief Canine Officer at The Kennel Club, commented: "This is an evolution to a broader, more comprehensive approach to address concerns relating to judging and handling of German Shepherd Dogs and to improve breed health more comprehensively both inside and outside of the show ring.

"The evidenced health challenges in German Shepherd Dogs, such as hip and elbow dysplasia, can't be assessed by dog show judges and are supported by our KC/BVA canine health schemes for hip and elbow screening, with good uptake from the breed community.

"The Kennel Club and German Shepherd Dog breed representatives are committed to working together to develop a comprehensive plan to improve judges' and exhibitors' education, as well as the health of the breed in and outside of the show ring. We are also reviewing ring procedures, handling measures and guidelines and ensuring these are consistent across all breeds, to ensure responsible dog showing and welfare standards."

The decision to reclassify the German Shepherd Dog was made by the Kennel Club Board following a recommendation from the Kennel Club Dog Health Group, which has been reviewing and discussing the health initiatives with breed representatives.

Andrew Winfrow of the German Shepherd Breed Council, and Breed Health Coordinator, Chris Hazel, commented: "The Kennel Club's recent decision to reclassify the German Shepherd Dog's status is the result of collaborative effort between the Kennel Club, breed experts, veterinarians, and

responsible breeders. This change recognises positive advancements in the breed's health, movement, and overall well-being. It also acknowledges the persistent work of the German Shepherd Dog Breed Council, whose members have worked tirelessly to address concerns, implement best practices, and advocate for responsible stewardship.

"The reclassification is seen by many as a testament to the breed's progress and a beacon for continued improvement."

This classification means that nine breeds remain on the Kennel Club's list of category three breeds: Basset Hound, Bulldog, Dogue de Bordeaux, French Bulldog, Mastiff, Neapolitan Mastiff, Pekingese, Pug and St Bernard. 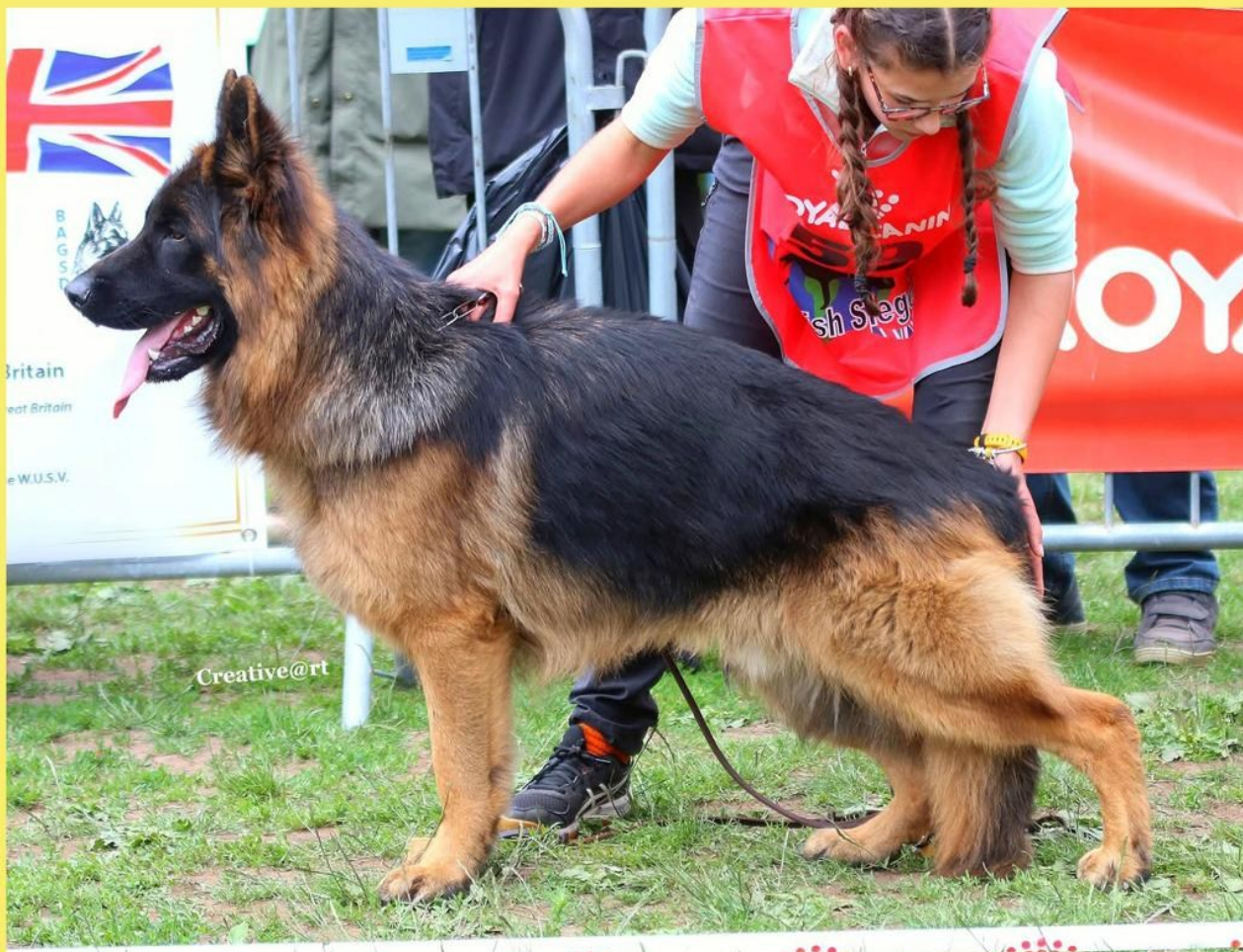

Gold bead implants – How acupuncture effects can be permanent

An overview of the procedure and how it looks in practice

It is probable, if you're reading this article, you're already aware of the susceptibility of German Shepherds to joint and spinal problems because of their size and genetic make-up. As vets we commonly see German Shepherds with hip or elbow dysplasia, resulting in early onset arthritis or other musculoskeletal concerns. Owners, particularly the experienced ones, know the drill – carefully choosing their next dog after exploring hip scores, researching breeding lines, yet also accepting they may still face a future of screening, diagnostics, careful management of diet/exercise, supportive therapies and prescriptions for drugs.

In this article I want to explain about Gold Bead Implantation. This minimally invasive treatment is internationally well-established but hardly known in the UK. Like most other therapies, it requires accurate diagnostics and as a referral service we insist on them before accepting patients. Wherever possible we work closely with professionals like physiotherapists and hydrotherapists who already know the case. A team approach enhances outcomes considerably and is especially important for patients that have difficulty travelling to us for check-ups.

My Background

For over two decades I have taken great joy in treating all creatures, great and small, often witnessing marked improvements when I use modalities such as acupuncture. It is always heartening to alleviate an animal's pain or discomfort, but bringing it the prospect of a

better future simultaneously is a precious opportunity.

When moving from rural mixed practice to small animal practice 13 years ago, and subsequently to dedicated referral work, my patients started coming from further afield. As perhaps to be expected, the more I have specialised, the greater my catchment area has become. I am, however, a little uneasy if poorly patients travel a long way to see me when modalities such as acupuncture require regular maintenance treatments. As you read on, you will see that for some common conditions there is an alternative.

It is by far the best part of my job seeing an improvement in many of my patients. Usually, the response to acupuncture can be seen fairly quickly. Unfortunately, depending on the condition and especially in chronic cases, regular treatments are needed to sustain the effect. This is where Gold Bead implants, a form of permanent acupuncture, offer a viable alternative to regular sessions of traditional acupuncture. It can also help in some cases where acupuncture isn't strong enough.

In my experience, most patients, even those who start out concerned by traditional acupuncture, become more at ease over time. Most of our patients experience deep relaxation during treatment. There are, however, some patients where this is unattainable and, in those cases, gold bead implants may be the answer. Not only does the treatment have good success rates^{1,2} but it also allows patients to avoid repeated needling of acupuncture points while saving time and travel for the owner. Training in Gold Bead Implantation and partnering with practices to perform this procedure has enabled me to see patients from greater distances. In a referral setting they only need to travel once to receive the full benefit of this procedure which is currently not widely available in the United Kingdom.

My exposure to dogs with gold bead implants started early in my career at the practice I worked for in Germany as a newly qualified vet. It was here that I did acupuncture on a patient that had received gold bead implants many years earlier. He led an active life without the need for painkillers despite severe hip dysplasia and, in his twilight years, needed my attention for geriatric concerns and the effects of the gold bead implants were swiftly reinvigorated with lasertherapy.

Even during those early years, Gold Bead implantation was already well-established in Germany and was showing real potential to improve long-term quality of life in animals with joint problems. It is noteworthy that, in severe cases, where serious surgery cannot be avoided in the longer term, already having gold bead

implants in place does not prevent a patient from going on to have a joint replacement. Likewise, Gold Bead implants can even be used when joint surgery or replacement didn't have the desired effect. We feel the question to ask the specialist is whether invasive surgery is likely to improve the functionality of the joint, what the success rates tend to be, what rehabilitation program is needed and how long the joint is likely to be functional with versus without surgery.

Bearing in mind the possible detrimental long-term effects of major surgery, the option of a less-invasive procedure which may resolve the symptoms or delay the need for surgery should be considered.

The Ins & Outs of the Procedure

Gold Bead Implantation involves the insertion of gold beads into acupuncture points near affected joints while the patient is sedated. Whilst there have been studies from around the world highlighting encouraging outcomes from this promising procedure, it has been relatively unheard of here in the UK. I am hopeful this will change and, to play my part in spreading the word, would like to share my experiences of carrying out this treatment through A.P. Vet, my small independent referral practice.

The method was first used for Hip Dysplasia by Grady Young¹ in the early 1970s and has remained fairly unchanged. His research centred on Gold Bead Implantation in German Shepherds and subsequent publications were devoted to this topic. The success rate reported, in different studies, varies between 75%¹ and 89%.²

It is also used for other joints, commonly stifle, elbow and along the spine. Additionally, conditions like epilepsy³ and urinary incontinence can be treated.

Long term effects have been looked at in a 2007 study. Lasting positive effects were observed in hips and 30 of the 36 dogs (83%) in the gold implantation group showed significant improvement including improved mobility and reduction in the signs of pain after 2 years' time.⁴

Hip Dysplasia in a Young Bitch

When I first met 2-year-old Mishka she was struggling with her 35kg weight which had accumulated due to her mobility issues. It was immediately evident that she wasn't walking well but it came as a bit of a shock learning that her orthopaedic surgeon, who carried out the diagnostics, recommended total hip replacement and mentioned euthanasia if the problem wasn't addressed.

To be fair, painkillers had made a difference for Mishka but a proactive long-term solution, short of very invasive surgery with a very long rehabilitation period, was needed. I discussed the possibility of Gold Bead Implants and Mishka's owner was keen to go ahead.

Gold beads were implanted earlier this year, and positive outcomes arose very swiftly. At the post-op check-up, a great improvement in the range of movement of the hip joints was already visible. Prior to the procedure, Mishka's level of exercise had been restricted over a long period. Consequently, it was decided that a rehab programme with a physiotherapist would help her to regain the activity levels usually seen in such a young dog more quickly and, most importantly, without putting too much strain on other joints that are at risk of developing arthritis as well.

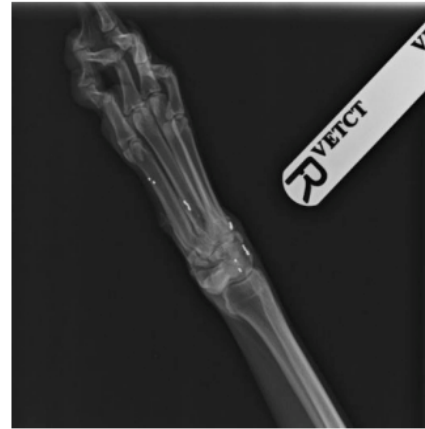

Both the A.P. Vet team and Mishka's owner have been delighted by her response to the procedure. Already, her hip mobility is great, and we can't

wait to see how she does once she regains better overall fitness from her physio programme.

Severe Arthritis of a Carpal Joint



Obtaining excellent imaging is essential for the procedure.

Blossom had major problems with her carpal joint. She developed severe arthritis after fracturing the bones near the joint as a young dog. More commonly I see problems with the carpal joints in sporting or agility dogs. The joints act as shock absorbers for the limb during weight bearing.

With the help of a cast and good rehabilitation, the need to fuse the joint was avoided. But 6 years later things got acutely worse, probably because Blossom slipped and fell. It was heart-breaking to see her scream in pain. The x-ray showed chronic arthritis that had, up to that point, been managed well with supplements. Cage rest and a very strong combination of painkillers were used at the beginning of a slow recovery. Admittedly, exchanging Meloxicam for Librela alongside opioids and Pardale made a big difference, as did the hydrotherapy. Nevertheless, an alternative to the strong multimodular painkillers was needed.

Acupuncture and laser therapy, whilst useful in the initial post-fracture rehabilitation period, didn't bring about sufficient results in Blossom's case. Consequently, gold bead implants were finally used and, happily, Blossom started to bounce back. Perhaps this adds weight to the argument that, in some instances, gold bead implants work where acupuncture treatments are less impactful.

Blossom improved swiftly and she never needed another Librela injection or opioids. She has gone back to her proper whippet life, including joyful running at high speed without being sore the next day. Most of the time she doesn't need painkillers at all. She occasionally has laser therapy or a short acting painkiller. Her implants were done 1.5 years ago, and she has never looked back.

Looking Forward

Mobility problems need thorough diagnostics and sometimes, unfortunately, drastic measures are unavoidable. Having integrated holistic therapies into conventional practice for a long time, I feel strongly that minimally invasive procedures such as gold bead implants deserve the weight and recognition in the UK that they already have in the USA and continental Europe. In my opinion, this treatment could considerably improve outcomes in the case of many animals we see and across a range of clinical conditions.

Gold Bead Implants have the potential to reduce pain, improve mobility and enhance quality of life. They can offer a minimally invasive alternative or supplement to traditional treatments like surgery or medications. Their benefit, especially for German Shepherd Dogs, is well documented.

At A.P. Vet we work with local practices to offer gold bead implants to our patients. If the referring vet is too far away or can't offer the use of their x-ray machine and surgical theatre, we have a practice we work with. Please reach out to us to find out more.

SG2 Glensmodan Elka – Large, a little deep in the chest. Very strong, very substantial. Well-formed head, high wither, harmoniously flowing top line, croup slightly short and steep. Good angulations fore, very good angulations hind quarter, steps from behind slightly narrow. Very good forehand reach.

SG3 Glensmodan Rogue – Very good expression, very good pigmentation, nice formed head. High wither, harmoniously flowing top line, croup slightly steep. Good angulations fore, very good angulations hind quarters, deep in the under chest.

SG4 Dahlmann Ulla – Medium strong. Upper arm should be slightly more angulated, wither could be a little higher, croup slightly short and steep.

SG5 Hundark Havok at Siskiva – Large, well pigmented, well-formed head. Top line is slightly roached, croup slightly steep, upper arm should be a little more angulated along with the hind quarters.

SG6 Etchica Pepper – Large, medium strong, well-formed feminine head. High wither, short and steep croup, upper arm should be more angulated along with the hind quarters. Good movement.

SG7 Gayville Varinka with Trimika – Little heavy, not firm on the top line. A little too masculine, a lot of substance. Slight issues with the croup and upper arm.

SG1 Hausruma Auroura – Very balanced, correct sized female. Medium strong, very good expression, very well-formed head. High wither, harmoniously flowing top line, good length and lay of the croup. Correct angulations fore and hind quarters, correct chest proportions. Slightly open front, hind quarter angulations good. Straight steps, powerful movement.

SG2 Kleehuegel Helga – Very good expression, very good pigmentation, very nice head. High wither, top line slightly roached, good croup. Correct angulations fore and hind quarters, straight steps.

SG3 Mati dei Murolo – Slightly stretched female, croup short and steep, upper arm could be more angulated. Movement is outstanding.

Adult Dog Stock Coat

SG1 Wally Vom Sudenville – Medium large, medium strong. Nice expression, well –formed masculine head, very good pigmentation. High wither, harmoniously flowing top line, croup slightly short and steep. Good angulations fore, very good angulations hind quarter, straight steps. Under chest a little short, needs more concentration in the movement.

SG2 Blerio Bezique @ Mascani – Very nice dog, forehand angulation is almost perfect. Upper head should be much more pronounced, neck should be slightly longer. Croup steep and short. Good movement with very good forehand reach.

SG3 Rafaye Rikkor at Tasella – Large, medium strong, very good pigmentation but eyes should be darker. High wither, harmoniously flowing top line. Croup is short, upper arm could be more angulated. Hind quarter angulation is a little too much, steps from behind are slightly narrow.

Adult Dog Long Stock Coat

SG1 Bossenburg Boss – Large, slightly stretched. Full of expression, well pigmented, well-formed head, dark eyes. High wither, harmoniously flowing top line. Slightly short, steep croup, good angulations fore, very good angulations hind quarter, straight steps. Moves well should be a little firmer on the top line.

SG2 Blaven Vom Wanakon – Very well pigmented, well-formed head, high wither, croup slightly steep. Good angulations fore, very good angulations hind quarter. Correct chest proportions, could be a little more stretched.

SG3 Kaizuka Bomber – Very good pigmentation, very nice formed head. High wither, croup short and steep, upper arm and hind quarter should be more angulated.

SG4 Lorgyle Arran – Very masculine head, very dark pigmented. High wither, short and steep croup. Good upper arm angulation, good hind quarter angulation. Needs to be more concentrated in the movement.

V1 Zandamor Genia – Very balanced, correct size, well pigmented, well-formed head. High wither, harmoniously flowing top line. Good length of croup, slightly steep. Correct angulations fore, very good angulations hind quarters, slightly narrow steps from behind. Correct chest proportions. Powerful movement. Perfect off lead.

V2 Zahel vom Amur – Large, substantial, very good pigmentation, well-formed head. High withers, harmoniously flowing top line, long croup slightly steep. Good angulations fore, very good angulations hind quarters, correct chest proportions. Straight front lines, steps from behind slightly narrow.

V3 Kleehuegel Evita – Very substantial, very well pigmented, stop on the head should be a little more pronounced. High wither, harmoniously flowing top line, long croup with good lay. Good angulations fore, very good angulations hind quarter, no over angulations, absolutely straight steps. Powerful movement.

V4 Bailey Vom Springberg – Beautiful female, upper arm should be a little more angulated. Moves very well.

Working Bitch Long Stock Coat

V1 Fenya Vom Springberg – Nice female with correct anatomy. Not a good performance in the ring.

V2 Brineack Italia vom Raubahaus – Correct size, medium strong, very well pigmented, well-formed feminine head. High wither, short steep croup. Upper arm should be a little more angulated, hind quarters should be more angulated. Pasterns are not quite firm but the performance is very nice.

Working Dog Stock Coat

V1 Tornado du val d'Anzin – Nice, substantial dog with very good pigmentation, very well formed head. High wither, harmoniously flowing top line. Good length and lay of the croup. Correct angulations of the forehand, hind quarter angulations a little too much. Very nice movement.

V2 Sting Di Casa Massarelli – Medium large, medium strong, good pigmentation, well-formed head. High wither but roached.

Working Dog Long Stock Coat

V1 Rommel V.D Templehoeve – Medium large, medium strong, very good pigmentation, well-formed head with dark eyes . Correct height to length proportions, high wither, harmoniously flowing top line, correct length and lay of the croup. Good angulation of the forehand, very good angulation of the hind quarter. Correct chest proportions, straight top line.

V2 Knut von der Wilden Dreizehn – Substantial, very good expression, well-formed head, notable dark mask. High wither, harmoniously flowing top line, croup slightly short and steep. Upper arm could be a little more angulated, hind quarter angulations could be a little more. Nice chest proportions.

V3 Samurai Armagedonas – Medium strong, large, good pigmentation, well-formed head. High wither, harmoniously flowing top line, croup good length and lay. Upper arm should be more angulated, hind quarter angulations should be a little more. Slightly deep in the chest.
